Greetings to you from the PNHZP family. It gives me great pleasure to present the last quarterly newsletter of this year. This quarter we celebrated Children's Day in association with Hayden Hall Community Development Centre, Darjeeling involving children from remote areas of Darjeeling. We also observed Child's Right week in association with the District Child Protection Unit, Darjeeling by organizing an outreach program for local students and teachers. In addition to this the Park also hosted 1364 students and 168 faculties from 29 institutes for educational tours of the park. The developmental work this quarter included remodeling of two herbivore enclosures for the purpose of housing Mishmi Takins that will be arriving at the Park from Tierpark Berlin Zoo, Germany in January. OUTREACH PROGRAMME

The outreach programme of the Park involves students of all levels including trainees. The programme includes a tour of the park followed by an interactive session where topics such as role and functions of the modern zoo, conservation breeding programmes, environmental issues and the work of the zoo in working towards conserving rare and endangered species are discussed. Educational material regarding information on the housed animals of the park, conservation breeding programmes of the zoo, its biodiversity etc. are distributed to the students along with notebooks and lunches.

During this quarter the education wing of the Park attended to 1364 students and 168 faculties from 29 institutes.

OBSERVING CHILD RIGHTS WEEK IN ASSOCIATION WITH DISTRICT CHILD PROTECTION UNIT, DARJEELING

The District Child Protection Unit organized various programs involving children to create awareness on Children Rights and Protection. The week long program from 14th November- 20th November, 2019 included an outreach program for under privileged children from Darjeeling and their escorts at Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park on 17th November 2019.

The program included 46 children and 10 escorts from Kanchenjunga Primary School and Holy Angels School in Darjeeling. The outreach program comprised of an educational tour of the park, a talk on the conservation of local flora and fauna of Darjeeling, information on the management of captive animals and the conservation

breeding program of the park along with a quiz competition and screening of a wildlife movie. The participants were given refreshments and educational materials at the end of the program.

One Reeves pheasant was acquired from the PNHZ Park, it was then skinned and preserved as a rolled specimen.



3. Skinning of one Barbet

Scientific Name: *Megalaimidae* Collected from Padma Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park Date of Collection: 12th December 2018 Acc No. : A/CR/25

One Barbet was collected from PNHZ Park, it was then skinned and preserved for further mounting.



4. Skinning of one Blue Sheep

Scientific Name: *Pseudois nayaur* Collected from Dowhill Satellite Zoo Date of Collection: 27th December 2018 Acc No. : BNHM/M/58

One Blue Sheep was acquired from Dowhill, it was then skinned. The skin was then soaked in chemical (solution of Carbolic acid, alum powder and salt) for a day so that it can be tanned for further mounting. The head of the animal was boiled in water so that all the flesh can be removed easily from the skull and it was kept dry for further mounting.

DEVELOPMENT WORK AT PNHZP IN THIS QUARTER

The developmental work taken up during this quarter include the construction of the back entrance to the conference hall at the new Bengal Natural History Museum (BNHM), construction of reinforcd fall as a protection measure against landslides, insatllation of solar panels, construction of concrete stairs behind the barking deer enclosure leading up to the herbivore night shelters, placement of additional railling as protective barriers in the herbivore enclosures, replacement of the PVC sheets in the pheasantry with clear glass panels for improved viewing, placement of new informative and directional signages around the park and painting of directional arrows in the visitors path for the convinience of the visitors and ease of maintenance of visitor flow in the park. The old enclosures for Barking Deer and Himalayan Goral were modified for Mishmi Takins that are being brought to PNHZ Park from Berlin Tier Park Zoo, Germany.
